



- Please read all instructions before beginning.
- Use scant 1/4" seam allowance throughout. I press seams open to reduce bulk.
- WOF = width of fabric from selvage to selvage
- SC = "subcut" strips previously cut into specific smaller pieces
- Stitch border strips end to end to make long sections per directions below using a straight seam rather than on a 45 degree angle to make most of fabric
- For all 3.0" fabric 10 squares in cutting instructions marked with a pencil image , draw one diagonal line on back of square. These will be used for flip and sew corners on flying geese blocks.
- . Images in instructions show Cream Gold colorway fabrics

Cutting Instructions:

Fabric 1:

Cut (2) strips 9.5" x WOF; SC (6) 9.5" squares.

Fabric 3:

Cut (2) strips 9.5" x WOF; SC (22) 3.5" x 9.5" Cut (1) strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (2) 9.5" x 3.5" Cut (2) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (14) 5.5" x 3.0"

Fabric 5:

Cut (6) strips 2.0" x WOF. From (3) strips cut (54) 2.0" x 2.0" Cut (3) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (16) 5.5" x 3.0"

Fabric 7:

Cut (3) strips 3.5" x WOF; SC (24) 3.5" squares Cut (2) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (14) 5.5" x 3.0"

Fabric 2:

Cut (9) strips 5.5" x WOF (borders).

Fabric 4:

Cut (3) 2.0" x WOF strips. (strip set) Cut (16) strips 2.25" x WOF (borders). Cut (2) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (14) 5.5" x 3.0" Cut (10) strips 2.5" x WOF (binding)

Fabric 6:

Cut (6) strips 2.0" x WOF; SC (24) 9.5" x 2.0" Cut (2) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (14) 5.5" X 3.0"

Fabric 8:

Cut (8) strips 2.0" x WOF; SC (24) 12.5" x 2.0" Cut (3) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (16) 5.5" x 3."

Fabric 9:

Cut (1) strip 3.5" x WOF; SC (6) 3.5" squares. Cut (2) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (14) 5.5" x 3.0".

Fabric 10:

Cut (1) strip 5.5" x WOF; SC (4) 5.5" squares

Cut (1) strip 15.5" x WOF; SC (17) 2.0" x 15.5" (sashing)

Cut (16) strips 3.0" x WOF; SC (204) 3.0" x 3.0"

Cut (3) strips 2.75" x WOF (border)

Cut (4) strips 2.25" x WOF (border)

Cut (6) strips 2.0" x WOF (strip sets)

Assembly Instructions:

Block A:



Using 2.0" strips of Fabrics 5 and 10, stitch one strip of each color together along its length to make a strip set. Make 3. SC

(48) 2.0" wide segments. Stitch two segments together to make a 4-patch block as shown. Make 24.



Stitch a 3.5" Fabric 7 square between two 4-patch blocks as shown. Make 12.



Stitch a 3.5" Fabric 7 square to each side of a 3.5" Fabric 9 square. Make 6. Stitch this section between two sections made in the prior step to make a 9-patch block.

Stitch 2.0" x 9.5" Fabric 6 piece to left and right of 9-patch block. Stitch 2.0" Fabric 5 squares to left and right of remaining 2.0" x 9.5" Fabric 6 sections. Join these to top and bottom of 9-patch block. Stitch 2.0" x 12.5" Fabric 8 piece to left and right of block. Stitch 2.0" Fabric 5 squares to each edge of remaining Fabric 8 2.0" x 12.5" sections and join

to top and bottom of block. These six Blocks will measure 15.5" square.



Using 2.0" strips of Fabrics 4 and 10, stitch one strip of each color together along its length to make a strip set. Make 3. SC (48) 2.0" wide segments. Stitch two segments together to make a 4-patch block as shown. Make 24. Stitch a 3.5" x 9.5" Fabric 3

section between two 4-patches as shown. Make 12.



Stitch a 3.5" x 9.5" Fabric 3 section to left and right side of Fabric 1 square. Stitch 4-patch sections made in previous step to top and bottom of block center. These six blocks will measure 15.5" square.

Sashings and Cornerstones

Lay out Blocks A and B in four horizontal rows of three blocks each following quilt cover image. Join blocks in horizontal rows by stitching a 2.0" x 15.5" Fabric 10 sashing piece between each of the three blocks.

Join three Fabric 10 sashing pieces to each other with a 2.0" Fabric 5 square between to make a horizontal sashing strip. (Make 3) Join horizontal block rows to horizontal sashing strips to complete quilt center.

First Border

Join two 2.25" Fabric 10 strips end to end. Make 2. Trim these borders 65.0" long and stitch to left and right of quilt.

Join three 2-3/4" Fabric 10 strips end to end. Trim into (2) sections 52.0" long and add to top and bottom of quilt.

Second Border

Join Two 2.25" Fabric 4 strips end to end. Make 2. Trim these borders 69.5" long and add to left and right of quilt.

Join Three 2.25" Fabric 4 strips end to end. Trim this into (2) pieces 55.5" long and add to top and bottom of quilt.

Flying Geese Blocks - Third Border

Using all 3.0" x 5.5" rectangles of all fabrics and Fabric 10 3.0" squares, stitch along the diagonal lines on the 3.0" squares, flip open, press and trim away excess layers.

Layout flying geese in order to make two rows like the image below (top and bottom border). The numbers below the strip



refer to the fabric number in each geese block.

Stitch a Fabric 10 5.5" square to each edge of these two border strips just made.

Join remaining flying geese blocks in order to make two side borders to match image below.



Stitch side borders to quilt and then add top and bottom border.

Fourth Border:

Stitch (5) 2.25" Fabric 4 strips end to end and trim into two sections 83.0" long. Stitch to left and right of quilt. Join remaining (4) 2.25" Fabric 4 strips into two border strips of two strips each. Trim these to 68.5" long and add to top and bottom of quilt.

Fifth Border:

Stitch (5) Fabric 2 strips end to end. Trim into (2) sections 86.0" long. Stitch to left and right of quilt. Stitch remaining Fabric 2 strips into two border sections of two strips each. Trim these 78.5" long and add to top and bottom of quilt.

Binding:

Stitch all binding strips end to end on a 45 degree angle, trimming away excess seam allowance and pressing seam open. Press entire binding in half lengthwise to make double fold binding.

Backing:

Backing for this quilt will have seams running horizontally across back of quilt. Cut backing into three sections each 2+1/3 yards long (84" long). Stitch these three sections together along the selvage edges.

If you layer your quilt top near the top of the quilt sandwich, you will end up with excess backing fabric to cut away at the bottom of the quilt sandwich – approximately 22" wide by 2-1/3 yard long which you could use to make a pillowcase to match your quilt.
