## Cutting

All strips are cut across the width of the (WOF) fabric.
Sky Blue (A):

- (4) $2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric (WOF) strips.

Robins Egg (B):

- See instructions to cut (6) $6^{\prime \prime}$ circles.

Blueberry (C):

- (4) $2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strips.

Lilac (D):

- (1) $6^{1 / 2 \prime} \times$ x WOF strip; cut into (5) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Violet (E)

- (1) $6^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip; cut into (5) $61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Yellow (F):

- (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (11) $3^{\prime \prime}$ circles.

Orange (G):

- (2) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips.

Pink (H):

- (6) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding
- See instructions to cut (10) 3" circles.

Teal (I):

- See instructions to cut (6) $6^{\prime \prime}$ circles.

Green (J):

- See instructions to cut (6) $6^{\prime \prime}$ circles.

Lime (K):

- See instructions to cut (6) $6^{\prime \prime}$ circles.

White (L):

- (3) $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 571 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the length of fabric (LOF).


## Appliqué Blocks Assembly

1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ outside the drawn lines.
2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
3. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press the two of each $6^{\prime \prime}$ circle and seven assorted $3^{\prime \prime}$ circles onto one $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 57^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric L strip.
4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to complete Column One.
5. Repeat Steps 1-4 to make Columns Three and Five.

## Block Assembly

6. Sew together one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric F strip and one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric G strip lengthwise, to make one F/G strip set. Repeat to make a second strip set. Sub-cut the F/G strip sets into twenty $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ F/G units.
7. Sew together two F/G units to make one Block One square. Repeat to make ten Block One squares total.


## Sashing Assembly

8. Sew two $2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF Fabric A strips and two 2" x WOF Fabric $C$ strips together, lengthwise, and alternating them, to make one strip set. Repeat to make two strip sets total. Sub-cut the strip sets into thirty-two $2^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ C/A/C/A units.


## Quilt Top Assembly

Refer to the quilt layout while assembling
9. Sew together three $6^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}$ Fabric E squares, two $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D squares and five Block Ones to make Column Two.
10. Sew together three $6^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D squares, two $6^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}$ Fabric E squares, and five Block Ones to make Column Four.
11. Sew together two $C / A / C / A$ units, along the short ends to make one short border. Repeat to make six short borders
12. Sew one short border to the top and bottom of each of the appliqued columns.
13. Sew the five columns together, in order, to make the quilt top.
14. Sew together ten $C / A / C / A$ units to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the borders to the quilt top.
15. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing and quilt as desired.
