Fabric F GENC 550 B (Lt. Blue \#1) $1 / 2$ yard
Fabric G GENC 552 B (Lt. Blue \#2)
$1 / 2$ yard
Fabric H GENC 545 B (Lt. Blue \#3) $1 / 2$ yard
Fabric I GENC 546 B (Lt. Blue \#4) $1 / 2$ yard
Backing any GENC fabric 43/4 yards

## Cutting

Fabric A (Dark Blue), cut:

- (10) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut into (160) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- (8) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ binding strips

Fabric B (Silver Music), cut:

- (5) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut into (40) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- (6) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut (80) large triangles using template A (or Tri Rec ruler)
- (3) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut into (20) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric C (Dark Periwinkle), cut:

- (5) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut into (40) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Fabric D (Light Periwinkle), cut:

- (8) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ inner border strips

Fabric E (Border Print), cut:

- (4) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 80^{\prime \prime}$ lengthwise strips, centering the same motif in the middle of each strip

Fabric F (Light Blue \#1), cut:

- (3) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut (20) triangles using template B and (20) triangles using template C (or use a Tri Rec ruler)

Fabric G (Light Blue \#2), cut:

- (3) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut (20) triangles using template B and (20) triangles using template C (or use a Tri Rec ruler)

Fabric H (Light Blue \#3), cut:

- (3) $4^{1 / 2 \prime 2} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut (20) triangles using template B and (20) triangles using template C (or use a Tri Rec ruler)

Fabric I (Light Blue \#4), cut:

- (3) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips; cut (20) triangles using template B and (20) triangles using template $C$ (or use a Tri Rec ruler)


## Plock efissembly

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each

Fabric A. With right sides together, place a marked square on one corner of a $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square as shown. Sew along the line. Flip the triangle open and press. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. In the same manner, sew marked squares to the three remaining corners of the B square to make a center unit. Make a total of 20 center units.

2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square. Layer a marked square right sides together with a $47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C square. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on each side of the drawn line. Cut the squares apart on the drawn line to make two half-square-triangle units. The units should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Make a total of 80 units (see illustration on the next page).

3. Place a marked Fabric A square from step 1 on the Fabric B corner of a unit from step 2, right sides together. Sew along the line. Flip the triangle open and press. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Repeat to make a total of 80 corner units.

4. Using the Fabric F template B triangles, place a triangle on the left edge of a Fabric B triangle as shown. Join the triangles and press the seam allowances toward the small triangle. Then sew a Fabric I template C triangle to the right edge of the Fabric B triangle as shown and press. Trim the unit to measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Make a total of 20 side units.

5. Repeat step 4, using the Fabric I template B triangles, Fabric B triangles, and the Fabric H template C triangles to make $20 \mathrm{I} / \mathrm{B} / \mathrm{H}$ side units.
6. Repeat step 4, using the Fabric H template B triangles, Fabric B triangles, and the Fabric H template $G$ triangles to make $20 \mathrm{H} / \mathrm{B} / \mathrm{G}$ side units.
7. Repeat step 4, using the Fabric G template B triangles, Fabric B triangles, and the Fabric H template F triangles to make $20 \mathrm{G} / \mathrm{B} / \mathrm{F}$ side units.

8. Lay out four corner units, one center unit, and one of each side unit as shown. Join the units into rows and then join the rows to complete a block. The block should measure $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Repeat to make 20 blocks total.


## Duilt edssembly

9. Join the blocks into five rows with four blocks each. Sew the rows together to make a $481 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ quilt center.
10. Join two fabric $D$ strips end to end to make a long strip. Make four strips. Trim the strips to measure $80^{\prime \prime}$ long.
11. Using the photo for reference, sew an $80^{\prime \prime}$-long Fabric D strip to the bottom of each Fabric E strip to make four $8^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 80^{\prime \prime}}$ border strips.
12. Center and pin step 11 border strips to each side of the quilt top, noting the orientation of each strip. Sew the strips, starting and stopping $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the raw edge and backstitch. Do not trim the excess.
13. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top diagonally with wrong sides together. This should align the strips from adjacent sides. Starting at the sewn seam as shown below, draw a $45^{\circ}$ line to the edge of the strip. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Repeat with the remaining corners of the quilt top.

14. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the fabric A $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$-wide binding strips, bind the edges to finish.
