Fabric 10: Twenty of Pattern B; Cut forty-nine 1-1/4" x 13-1/2", fifteen of Template C, twenty-eight of Template $D$ and nine 2-1/4" x WOF for binding
Fabric 11: Cut two 5-1/2" x 77-1/2" LOF, two 5-1/2" x 83-1/2" LOF, six 2-3/4" x 2-3/4" from remaining fabric. *See general instructions.

## Block Construction:

## Making the Appliquéd Block

Note: If you are using the fusible appliqué method use the inside line on patterns $A$ and $B$ on the fabrics and fusible material. For the needle-turn method, use the outside line on patterns $A$ and $B$ on the fabrics.

1. Trace one copy of template $A$ and template $B$ to the template plastic (following the instructions above). Cut out and use as a pattern to cut out the indicated number of pieces from the fabrics in the cutting instructions.
2. (Fusible method) Trace ten each of pattern $A$ and eighty of pattern $B$ onto the paper side of the fusible web, leaving at least $1 / 2$ " space between each piece. Cut out the pieces slightly larger than the template. Following manufacturer's instructions, iron the pieces to the wrong side of the indicated fabrics in the cutting instructions. Cut out each piece on the inside line.
3. Center one Fabric 1 " $A$ " piece, four Fabric 6 " $B$ " pieces and two each of Fabrics $\mathbf{7}$ and 10 pieces to the right side of one Fabric 8 14" x 14" square.
4. Appliqué each piece using your prefered method.Make ten appliquéd blocks. Square block to 13-1/2".


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## Make the Cornerstone Blocks

5. Trace one copy of template $C$ and template $D$ to the template plastic. Cut out on the outside line and use as a pattern to cut out the indicated number of pieces from the fabrics in the cutting instructions.
6. Cut two Fabric $112-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares in half diagonally once to make four medium triangles. Cut the remaining four Fabric $112-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares in half diagonally twice to make sixteen small trianlges (use only fourteen).
Cut the remaining twenty-five $2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 2-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabrics 2, 3, 4, and $\mathbf{5}$ in half diagonally twice to make ninety-eight small trianlges.
7. Sew one Fabric 2 small triangle to the left side of one Fabric 7 " $D$ " piece. Sew one Fabric 4 small triangle to the right side of the " $D$ " piece.
8. Matching centers, stitch one Fabric 10 " C " piece to the long side of the unit.

9. Matching centers, stitch one Fabric 11 medium triangle to the opposite side of the "C" piece to make a cornerstone block 1.

Using the color combinations and positions indicated, make one each of blocks 2, 3 and 4.

9. Sew blocks 5-14 in the same manner, but with two pieced "D" units instead of the medium triangle. Using the color combinations and positions indicated, make the number of each block needed.

## Assembling the Quilt

12. Refer to the Quilt Layout diagram; lay out two appliquéd blocks and two Fabric $913-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, alternating with five sashing strips as indicated to make a block row. Make five block rows noting the orientation and placement of each unit in each row.
13. Refer to the Quilt Layout diagram; lay out five cornerstone blocks, alternating with four sashing strips as indicated to make a sashing row. Make six sashing rows noting the orientation and placement of each unit in each row.

Fabrics in the cornerstones should match the center strip in the sashing.


## Adding the Border

14. Sew the two Fabric $115-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 83-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the sides of the quilt. Sew the two Fabric $115-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 77-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.

## Finishing

15. Layer, quilt and bind with the nine Fabric $102-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips sewn, short ends together with diagonal seams, using a French binding technique.
