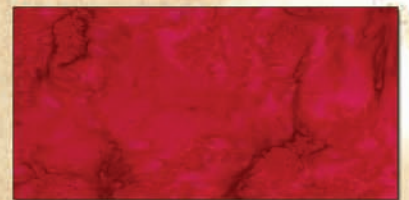
Quilt size 42" square

L4170 33-Cream 1-1/2 yds

(2-7/8 yds backing of your choice)



1895 261-Blue Jay 1 yd
(including binding)



1895 5-Red 5/8 yd

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Note: WOF = Width of Fabric

CUTTING

From Fabric A (feature), cut (9) 10 ¼" squares centering (fussy cutting) various scenes.

From Fabric B (red), cut (7) strips 3" x WOF. Take (2) of the strips and sub-cut into (8) 3" x 10 ½" rectangles. Set aside for later.

From Fabric C (blue), cut (7) strips 3" x WOF. Take (2) of the strips and sub-cut (2) 3" squares and (2) 3 x 10 ½" rectangles from each, for a total of (4) 3" squares and (4) 3 x 10 ½" rectangles. Set these aside for later.

Also from Fabric C, cut (5) strips 2 ¼" x WOF, for binding.

CONSTRUCTION

Sew (1) Fabric B WOF to Fabric C WOF at long edge. Sub-cut into (4) 5 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles. Repeat 2 more times, ending with a total of (12) 5 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles.

Sew (1) Fabric B WOF to a Fabric C WOF at the long edge and sub-cut into (8) 3 x 5 ½" rectangles. You will be cutting across the width of the 2 sewn strips, every 3". Repeat.

From the (8) 3 x 5 ½" rectangles, make (4) Four Patches, alternating the colors. The blues will sit diagonally from each other and the reds as well.

Lay out your feature fabric in a pleasing arrangement. You can start sewing the “feature blocks” together, alternating the B and C fabrics, in between. Use the photo as a guide.

Now that your “feature blocks” are sewn in separate rows, take the 5 ½” x 10 ½” rectangles, the 3 x 5 ½” rectangles and the Four Patches and sew the horizontal sashings.

Attach the “feature block” rows , interspersing the 2 horizontal sashing rows between.

Take all the remaining pieces and attach to top and bottom of the quilt. Once again use the photo for easy reference.

Layer backing, batting and your pieced top. Quilt and bind using your favorite method.
